Governor Monitoring

Governor monitoring will be carried out in various ways depending on the nature of the key priorities described in the School Improvement Plan and accordance with the monitoring plan. Monitoring can include:

- Learning walks in and around school;
- Looking for evidence in pupil books;
- Sharing informal observations & experiences.
